Principal's Message

Hello General Stewart Family!! We are so happy to be back and we can't wait to have students back with us! We hope that you had a fantastic summer with lots of fun and memories. This will be a very exciting year and we have plans for many exciting activities, both new and familiar. The last couple of years have been challenging for a number of reasons but we look forward to re-connecting with our Community. There have been many lessons learned over the past two years and some of the adjustments that were made have proven to be beneficial.

One of these adjustments was the closing of school doors. This is known as having a secure facility. It does not mean that parents/guardians/grandparent, etc. are not able to come into the school. What it does mean is that people will need to call or use the doorbell to connect with the office in order to be provided entry into the school. This prevents unauthorized individuals from entering the school and all elementary schools in Lethbridge School division are continuing this practice. We want you to know that we truly value our families and will continue to endeavour to make the school a warm, welcoming place for everyone in our community.

Please remember that we also have a staggered entry for all students in Kindergarten to grade 5 where students with last names from A – H come on Tuesday, September 6 and students with last names form I – Z come on Wednesday, September 7^{th} . Then all students attend on Thursday, September 8^{th} .

Another change that has been very beneficial for students has been the change in drop off and pick up procedures. We will continue to have parents drop off and pick up students outside of the school. This procedure has benefitted students by encouraging more independence and responsibility for students of all ages. This change has been very positive for students, particularly in Kindergarten where there have been significantly less tears from students at the start of school. This makes sense when you look at how the situation has changed from the student's perspective. Previously, having a parent bring them to the class and then leave them there is very different than bringing students to school and having them leave their parents to go to school. This is also a practice that we will continue.

However, we also recognize the importance of the first day of school and in order to provide an opportunity for parents and guardians to see classrooms and be a part of the school, each class will have an "Open House" for the last 15 minutes of each student's staggered entry day. This means that K parents and guardians will be able to come into the classroom starting at 11:26 am and Grade 1 - 5 parents and guardians will come in at 3:07 pm. We think that this is a great way to start the school year off in order to set students up for success and share memories of this special occasion.

Thank you for your excitement, support, and enthusiasm for this school year. We look forward to working hard, having fun and continuing to make General Stewart the best it can be!

Lethbridge School Division does not decide what is taught in our schools. However, our teachers decide how the curriculum is taught in their classrooms.

New K-6 Curriculum Development & Implementation

Alberta Education released its **new K-6 curriculum** in English Language Arts and Literature, Mathematics, and Physical Education and Wellness on April 13, 2022.

English Language Arts and Literature (K–3), Mathematics (K–3), and Physical Education and Wellness (K–6) will be used in classrooms across Alberta beginning in the fall of 2022. Additional curriculum will be implemented and/or piloted in 2022/2023.

Alberta Education has shared new curriculum resources for parents and school boards, as well as an **implementation plan**, on their new digital resource, **LearnAlberta**.
