- 1. School Report Chris
 - a. Halloween Parade October 31st K parade just prior to morning recess 10:00, Grade 1-5 parade starting at 12:55. Carnival to follow. Teams link will be set up as well for parents to watch. Students setting up the Haunted house the Friday before and the morning of. Parade will be about 15-20 minutes.
